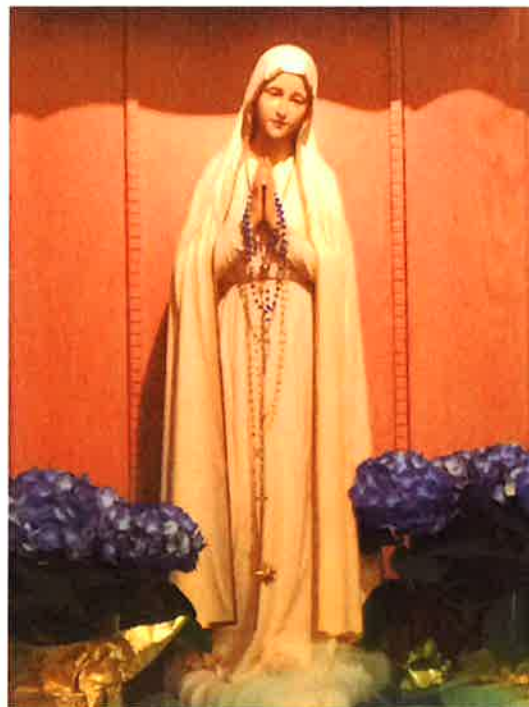

St. Cecilia's Cemetery Rules

Please cooperate so the cemeteries can be maintained with proper respect for persons whose memory is honored by the cemetery. The following are general rules, however, the Cemetery Board and/or persons acting under authority of the Board are authorized in their discretion to remove and dispose of any plant, urn, pot or grave decoration, or any other thing, at any time, without notice.



No ground planting of flowers, trees, or shrubs is permitted. No edging material, such as plastic, steel, marble, stone, wood chips, etc. is allowed.

The only items allowed on each plot other than the headstone are one or two, urns, flower pots, cemetery candles in proper receptacles, or military flags. All should be placed on or at either end of the headstone as space permits. Military flags should be placed tight to either end of the headstone. Nothing should be placed on the lot itself. Pots should be filled by June 15th or they will be removed.

Flower pots should be removed by October 15th or they will be removed.

Christmas or winter decorations should be removed any time after January 1st or they may be removed at our discretion.

Artificial flowers and other decorations are permitted for a single season (May through October). If they become unsightly or weather-worn they will be removed.

The Cemetery will not be responsible for anything of a moveable character that may be lost or misplaced.

Separate receptacles are located along the side of the Church for plastics and other refuse. Please do not throw any refuse in the Cemetery.

Any decoration deemed inappropriate, undignified, harmful or hazardous will be removed without notification or consultation. Cemeteries will be open from dawn until dusk.

Catholic Cemeteries affirms Vatican teaching on Cremation

Pope Francis has directed the Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith to publish new instructions reaffirming teaching that the Catholic Church is not opposed to cremation, while continuing to recommend that cremated remains of the deceased be buried in Catholic cemeteries or other sacred spaces, such as a church or an area set aside for burial. The Church does not allow for the cremated remains to be placed in a residence, nor are they to be scattered in the air, on land or at sea, or preserved in mementos, such as jewelry or other objects. Church teaching also prohibits cremated remains from being divided among family members. Cremation was permitted by the Catholic Church in 1962 and incorporated into Canon Law in 1983. Catholics need to understand the Church teaching that surrounds cremation and burial of cremated remains, so there are no misunderstandings at the time of death.

Parish Council – Mission, Membership, and Selection

The role of the council is to serve in an advisory capacity to the Pastor and aid in the administration of the parish. There are different models for councils. After our merger in 2009, our council was focused on planning, but under Rev. James Kirkpatrick, and now under Father Ted we have evolved toward a coordinating model.

To serve that model our membership now consists of individuals appointed from the various organizations and ministries and at-large members nominated by parishioners.

The two organizations now represented include the Altar and Rosary Society and the Catholic Men's Fellowship Group. Ad hoc members, who attend meetings on an occasional basis are: Bereavement, Cemetery, Genesee-Wyoming Vicariate, and the Diocesan Migrant Ministry. Trustees are members of the council and also represent the Finance Committee. Staff members are the Pastor, Deacon, Office Manager, and the Faith Formation Coordinator.

There are eight at-large members, four from each site. Since this is the first election under this new model, all eight will be elected. Terms of office are three years, except for this first election, the two individuals with the greatest number of nominations will serve the full three year term, and the two individuals with the next greatest number of nominations will serve a two year term. Subsequent elections will be for a full three year term.

The nomination process will be from May 27th through July 31st. Each parishioner may nominate up to eight people, four from each site. Nomination forms are included in the bulletin. Place completed forms in the boxes located at the entrances of each site.

Not only did we benefit from the volunteers at our church site, but, we received an additional benefit of several refurbished bikes we have to be given to anyone in need that were repaired and made useable again. The bikes were delivered to the Elba site by Habitat for Humanity.
