The Diocese of Buffalo wishes to honor couples who will observe their 50th, 60th, and 70th anniversaries this year. They are invited to celebrate their Golden and Diamond Anniversaries of Marriage in 2017 to a special Mass at St. Joseph's Cathedral on Sunday, October 15, 2017 at 3:00pm. During Mass couples will renew their marriage vows, followed by a reception at the Adam's Mark Hotel. Please let us know if you are interested in participating.

## July 13 – The Third Apparition

This time as the children made their way to the Cova, there was a crowd of believers who came with them. The Cova was on the family property and was used to grow crops, so all these people going there were ruining their crops. Lucia's mother was disturbed that so many people were on their property and constantly coming to her house looking for Lucia. After saying the rosary, again at noon, the sound of a soft lightning was heard and the lady was there. This time the lady asked the children to pray the rosary in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary. Lucia asked for a miracle so people would believe the visions were real. Our Lady answered by saying that she would tell her what she wanted and who she was and that she would perform a miracle in October. She told the children to continue to make sacrifices for poor sinners and say, "O Jesus, this is for the love of Thee, for the conversion of sinners and in reparation for offenses committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary." She then lowered



her hand and showed them hell

and told them, "You have seen hell where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved and there will be peace. The war is going to end; but if people do not cease offending God, a worse one will break out during the pontificate of Pius XI. When you see a night illumined by an unknown light, know that this is the great sign given you by God that He is about to punish the world for its crimes by means of war, famine, and persecutions of the Church and of the Holy Father." She also asked that Russia be consecrated to her and that the devotion of First Saturdays established for atonement of sins. She promised peace if her wishes were granted and also told Lucia and Jacinta that they could tell Francisco what she said, since Francisco could only see the visions, but not hear them.

They were to keep the other parts of the message secret from everyone else. The children promised they would do this. After the vision, they returned home, accompanied by the throng of followers. Word of the children and their visions reached the ears of Arthus Santor, the mayor and administrator. He requested that their parents bring the children to City Hall for questioning.

**St. Padre Pio Parish Unapproved Council Minutes**  
**June 19, 2017, Oakfield Site**

*We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."*

**Members in Attendance:** Father Thaddeus Bocianowski, Reg Barcomb, Barb Hendershott, Linda DeVito, Diane Fiorentino, Rob Greene, Jan Goodenbery, Mary Ann Dorman, Mary Ann Conley, Mindy Stempin, Rhonda Natalizia.

**Members absent:** Deacon Paul Kulczyk, Nadyne Karas, Justin Calarco-Smith, Charles Zambito, Debbie Greene. The meeting was called to order at 7:03 pm by President, Barb Hendershott. The opening prayer was offered by Linda. Barb volunteered to give the opening and closing prayers at the next meeting.

**Minutes from the previous meeting:** Motion made by Jan, seconded by Rob to approve the April 3, 2017 minutes. Motion carried. Linda pointed out an error in the May minutes; the Liturgy meeting is scheduled for June 28<sup>th</sup>, not the 25<sup>th</sup>. Motion made by Reg, seconded by Jan to approve the minutes with the correction. Motion carried.

**Open Forum:**

*Use of the Elba rectory for emergency housing* – Paula Callahan requested that the council consider using the rectory for housing for the summer for a client of hers. The individual is having difficulty finding a place and needs to vacate the current place by the end of June. Given the needs of the client, Mary Ann D. pointed out that the rectory would not be the best place. Diane moved and Mary Ann C. seconded a motion to refer the matter to the steering committee. Motion carried.

*Fund Raising possibilities with McNichols's Redemption Center* – Mary Ellen Wilbur proposed setting up an account with the redemption center so that parishioners can take returnables to the center and they would send a check to the church on a yearly basis. After some discussion, it was moved by Jan, seconded by Reg to place an announcement in the bulletin explaining the program. Diane will look into the details required.

**Organization and Committee Reports:**

*Altar and Rosary* –Diane reported that the banquet was Tuesday at the Dibble Center. New officers are Diane, President; Linda Giambone, Vice President; Mary Ellen Wilbur, Secretary; Norma Day, Treasurer. Next meeting is in September.

*Men's Group* – Rob reported that the Chicken BBQ sold out, 283 dinners were pre-sale and 127 were sold the day of the event. Pre-sale is important, because the chickens have to be ordered a week in advance. A parishioner donated dinners for the altar servers, who were surprised and pleased to receive free dinners. Reg won the 50-50 and donated the money back to the Men's Group. Muck Dog game tickets for July 21<sup>st</sup> will go on sale this weekend. Tickets are \$3. Altar servers will receive free tickets when accompanied by a paying adult.

*Liturgy Committee* – The next meeting is June 28<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 pm in Oakfield. Father Czeslaw Krysa, head of Liturgy for the Diocese will speak.

**Areas of Attention:**

**Community Building:**

*Coffee socials* – We still need volunteers for August. It was suggested that we revisit how we do the socials before next year.

**Faith Formation:**

Father reported that a meeting with the teachers is scheduled for this Sunday, after 10 am Mass. The purpose of the meeting is discuss possible changes to the program and receive input. He is also looking to make changes to the job description of the coordinator.

**Stewardship:**

*Oktoberfest* – Mary Ann D. reported that we have the amount needed for the money raffle. The next meeting will be at the Elba Fire Hall to check the layout.

*Building and Grounds* – Reg reported that the plan to replace the Oakfield rectory windows is ongoing. Windows are purchased when they are on sale. The roof project is completed in Elba. The cross on the roof was crooked, but the roofer straightened it for us as a good will gesture.

**Old Business:**

*Steering Committee for Reuse of Elba Rectory* – The next meeting is Thursday, June 29<sup>th</sup>, 7 pm at the Elba site. A representative from the Alzheimer's Assoc. will be present to explain the proposed program. Other uses will also be discussed at the meeting.

*Election of Parish Council members* – No problems reported. Nomination forms are due by July 31. Forms are needed in Elba.

*Saturday Masses* – A summary of the parishioner survey was distributed. Barb and Linda described the findings: Totals were: 101 surveys returned; 33 votes for 4 pm, 26 votes for 4:30 pm, and 34 votes for 5 pm. Some individuals did not select a mass or indicated more than one. People attending mass in Elba numbered 30; people attending mass in Oakfield numbered 63. People who attend mass at 4 pm, strongly want the 4 pm time. People who attend mass at 5:30 pm are divided between 4:30 and 5 pm. People who attend mass on Sunday morning strongly favor 5 pm. The comments were generally favorable to the idea of one mass. Some suggestions included changing times with the sites, for example, having an earlier mass in the winter to avoid driving in the dark. Various options were discussed. Motion made by Reg, seconded by Jan to recommend to Father that one Saturday evening mass at 4:30 pm be adopted. An amendment to the motion to begin the new schedule on January 1, 2018 was made by Linda and seconded by Rob. The amendment passed and the main motion as amended was adopted. After the initial January to April time in Oakfield, the schedule will be May to October in Elba. November to April in Oakfield. (*Addendum to the minutes: At the Calendar Meeting on June 26<sup>th</sup>, Father accepted the recommendation of the council to have one 4:30 pm Saturday mass, but prefers to begin the schedule on December 23, 2017, because of the Christmas schedule of masses on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>.*)

**Pastor's Comments:**

*Fatima Celebration* – The celebration for the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Fatima will be August 13. Bishop Malone will attend. A concert with Brittany Mruzek, soprano, accompanied by Steve Kroczyński, guitarist will begin at 2 pm. Mass will follow. Light refreshments will be served. Invitations are being sent to village and county officials, former parishioners and pastors, and priests in the Vicariate. The Knights of Columbus will participate. A tent will be rented. We expect at least several hundred people to attend.

*Upon this Rock* – We were a little under our goal, but the Diocese reached its goal of \$100 million. The campaign was successful.

*Cemetery* – A Blessing of the new benches and flag pole was after the 10 am Mass on June 18<sup>th</sup>, Father's Day. The VFW and American Legion were there with their colors, taps were played, and choir members led the group in a couple of patriotic songs. Coffee and donuts were served.

**Adjournment and Closing Prayer:**

The meeting was adjourned at 8:43 pm. Linda offered the closing prayer.

**Next meeting:** June 26<sup>th</sup>, Calendar meeting, at the Oakfield site. Next regular Council Meeting, Aug. 28<sup>th</sup>, 7 pm, at Elba Site.
