August 28, 2017, Elba Site

We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."

Members in Attendance: Father Thaddeus Bocianowski, Deacon Paul Kulczyk, Barb Hendershott, Reg Barcomb, Diane Fiorentino, Rob Greene, Nadyne Karas, Justin Calarco-Smith, Charles Zambito, Debbie Greene, Mary Ann Dorman, Mary Ann Conley and Mindy Stempin,.

Members absent: Linda DeVito, Rhonda Natalizia and Jan Goodenbery.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President, Barb Hendershott. The opening prayer was offered by Barb. Deacon Paul volunteered to give the opening and closing prayers at the next meeting.

Minutes from the previous meeting: Motion made by Mary Ann C, seconded by to Mary Ann D the June 19, 2017 minutes. Motion carried.

Open Forum: Nothing to Report.

Organization and Committee Reports:

Altar and Rosary –Diane reported the Ministry is on Summer Recess. The next meeting is September 12th.

Men's Group – Rob reported that the 60 tickets were sold for the Muck Dogs baseball game and a good time was had by all. The Pancake Breakfast will be held on October 15th from 8am until noon with a free will donation and a 50/50 drawing will be held. The Group will be cooking hot dogs and hamburgers for the Faith Formation Catechetical Sunday Family Meeting which will be held on September 17th after the 10 o'clock mass.

Liturgy Committee – Nothing to Report.

Bereavement Ministry- Barb reported the summary after several meetings of discussion on usage of the books which have been provided by Justin's business. Volunteers will bundle the books along with a usage summary and a note from Father. At the time of the Funeral Mass these books will be offered to the family of the departed.

Faith Formation: Mary Ann D reported that sufficient response to move forward with class formation. The Diocese has made changes to the curriculum and teachers will proceed accordingly. Plans for a monthly Children's Mass is in process. The 9-11 grades will be working in a "service program" by helping ministries and then being rewarded points towards a goal. The 5 young adults in the Confirmation Group will be participating with Our Lady of Mercy in LeRoy this year.

Stewardship:

Oktoberfest –Nadyne noted that the transition to the new site will eliminate moving chairs and tables between sites. The floor plan has been designed.

Building and Grounds – Reggie reported that the Finance Council has approved the request to obtain estimates for the replacement of frames and stained glass windows on the East side at the Oakfield Church. However, it is likely that this project will not move forward until Spring 2019 due to contractors full calendars for 2018. Pcionek Paving has sealed and striped the parking lots of both sites free of charge. Mary Ann D painted the entrance doors of the Elba site which coordinate with the OLF Shrine background beautifully. Due to inclement weather, updating the Oakfield garage is pending.



Old Business:

Steering Committee for Reuse of Elba Rectory – Deacon Paul reported that the rectory doors have been secured for the Hispanic Office. On September 6th a visit is planned to the Old Trinity Lutheran Church in Buffalo to observe their Alzheimer's daycare program. There was discussion regarding the possibility of usage of the Elba Hall as an Alzheimer's respite program location on the basis of one day a month for a few hours similar to a program held at a local Indian Falls Church. Advertising for clients would go through Office for the Aging. This concept is only in the questions and answers stage. No decision has been made to move forward.

New Business:

Election of Parish Council Members – The announcement will appear in the Bulletin.

Pastor's Comments:

Fatima Celebration – The celebration for the 100th anniversary of Fatima which was held August 13th had approximately 300 in attendance. Father expressed thankfulness and gratitude to all. Bishop Malone was surprised and thankful to receive the beautiful Fatima stole. The concert provided by Brittany Mruzek was beautiful. Father shared the Genesee County Legislative Commendation for the Fatima Celebration with the Council.

Adjournment and Closing Prayer:

The meeting adjourned at 8:55 pm. Barb offered the closing prayer.

Next meeting: October 10th at 7 pm, at Oakfield Site.

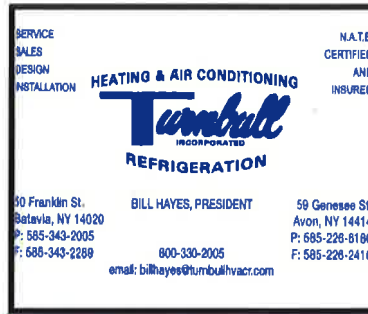
