



The History of St Josephs Table.....

The origin of the St Joseph's Table goes back to the 15th century when the western region of Sicily was stricken by a severe drought and famine. Farmers then promised their favorite patron, St. Joseph, that they would offer a dinner for the poor if he would send rain and save the population. St. Joseph answered their prayers, so the Sicilians were stuck with their part of the deal ever since. Since this miracle occurred during Lent, it was necessary for this to be a meatless feast. Because Sicily's climate is warm, oranges, figs and lemons were

prevalent at the first feasts. Since the tradition came to America "tables" have been set up in private homes and in large village gatherings. This is a community celebration of faith, thanksgiving, fellowship and charity. The poor are not forgotten, and the sick or elderly are provided a "take-away" dish.






