

St. Padre Pio Parish Unapproved Council Minutes April 24, 2018, Oakfield Site

We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."

Members in Attendance: Father Thaddeus Bocianowski, Deacon Paul Kulczyk, Barb Hendershott, Reg Barcomb, Linda DeVito, Debbie Greene, Diane Fiorentino, Mindy Stempin, Debbie Armbrewster, Mary Ann Dorman, Pauli Miano, Sue Zambito, Charles Zambito.

Members absent: Justin Calarco-Smith, Kevin Hendershott.

The meeting was called to order at 7:04 pm by Barb Hendershott. The opening prayer was offered by Linda. Deacon Paul offered to give the opening and closing prayers at the next meeting.

Minutes from the previous meeting: Motion to approve the minutes made by Diane, seconded by Sue. Motion carried.

Open Forum:

Organization and Committee Reports:

Altar and Rosary – Diane reported that about 75 people attended the Night of Reflection. All altar servers, except 3, have been presented with new robes. Waiting for cushions and the smaller chairs for the altars at both sites. Earned about \$1100 at Rummage Sale. Need additional people to bake cookies for the Bread Man event on May 8th. We still have space for additional signups to attend.

Men's Group – Reg reported for Kevin. Chicken BBQ is June 10th, from 11 am. To 1 pm. Tickets will be on sale for 4 weekends after masses and in the office. Presale tickets will be \$9; after June 3rd, the price is \$10. Chickens are ordered in advance, and we need an accurate count.

Liturgy Committee — Mindy reported that the subcommittee on ministries is nearly finished. One final meeting will be held, and then the procedures will be distributed. May crowning will be at the shrine after the 8 am Mass on May 6th. Other statues will have crowns placed privately. Father stated that the Mass for the Ascension will be celebrated on the weekend of May 12/13. Deb A. reported that additional help is needed around Christmas and Easter, both with setting up and taking down the decorations. Thanks to Amanda and Karen Fox for their assistance in decorating for Easter. Volunteers should contact Deb or Mindy. St. Joseph's Table — Sue reported that \$435 was raised at the event on March 19th. Proceeds were donated to the Share the Journey Outreach Center. After the 8 am Mass 75 people attended. After the 10 am Mass, there were 26, about double from last year. There was more participation from children and families. 12 baskets were raffled off.

Areas of Attention:

Community Building:

Coffee Socials – The council is responsible for hosting the socials that include the early bird drawings before Oktoberfest. Sign-up sheet was passed around. We still need people for the May 27th event. Socials will be May 27th at Oakfield, after 10 am Mass, June 24th at Elba, after 8 am Mass, July 29th at Oakfield, after 10 am Mass, and August 25th at Elba, after the 4:30 pm Mass.

Share the Journey – Deb said that she has purchased supplies for the pantry; items are going fast, and we need some means of sustaining the program. Possibilities include: money from the bottle/can redemption, asking groups to contribute from their raffles, having children save their pennies, asking parishioners to donate items. We are looking to set up a library in the rectory dining room with Catholic books and religious articles. Jody and Steve Perkins and Sally Ross have volunteered to assist.

Faith Formation: Mary Ann reported on the retreats for the First Reconciliation and the First Communion students. Effort was made to have children feel comfortable with the process of confession. A teaching Mass with hands on activities was helpful to First Communion students in understanding the meaning of parts of the Mass. Parents participated and were positive in their comments. JoAnn DeMare helped with the teaching Mass, and Rose Elliott and Margaret Pedro helped with the Communion retreat. We are asking for early registration for next year. Discount of \$25 per child for registration before July 1st. Early purchase of books results in a discount for us. Protecting God's Children Training is required for people involved with activities involving the children. We hope to have training at our site in September. Training on June 5th is scheduled at Notre Dame HS in Batavia. Mary Ann attends Diocesan training for Faith Formation coordinators monthly. Training and networking are helpful to her as a new coordinator.

Stewardship:

Building and Grounds – Reg –Day of Caring is from 9 to 3 on May 16th. We are asking for 8 to 10 workers to do yard cleanup at both sites and paint the outside window frames of the church at Elba. Color will be same as the front doors of the church. We are continuing with replacement of the Oakfield rectory windows. 9 will be replaced this year, and next year should complete the project. A new front door was installed at Oakfield. The elevator is being installed and will be available this weekend. Wind damage —Oakfield: A couple of roof shingles were noted on pavement near rectory. Upper roof will be checked to determine origin. Elba: A couple strips of siding need to be replaced on garage and the shed needs to be re-roofed (even though just a few shingles were blown off). Other minor repairs to shed are needed. It would be helpful if volunteers could do these repairs. The two shrubs on either side of the door to the church are too large. They need to be removed and perhaps replaced. No objections to their removal were noted.

(We still need volunteers to assist with counting at masses at Resurrection parish this weekend.)

Old Business:

Signboards at both sites – After some discussion on what should be listed at each site, Father said that he and Pauli would meet soon, review the signs and decide on changes.

Parish Councils' Need for Review and planning – Deb distributed an updated mission statement and suggested subcommittees and chairs. Linda reported on the origin of the self study of St. Cecilia parish and St. Patrick parish done in 2006 in preparation for discussions around the Journey in Faith and Grace. It could provide a starting point for the planning process. She commented that the Diocese wants each parish to do long term planning, and it is important that we do that both for ourselves and for the Diocese.

Subcommittees: Administration – Father Ted/Deb; Building and Grounds – Reg; Community Life – Barb; Faith Formation – Mary Ann; History – Linda; Liturgy – Linda Giambrone. Committee chairs are asked to find several people to assist them.

New Business:

Calendar planning for 2018 – 2019 – People should submit items for the calendar to Deb no later than the May meeting, so she can prepare a draft calendar for approval at the June meeting. Items may be submitted by e-mail, the earlier the better. Participation request by Betterment Committee for Oakfield Labor Daze – Barb reported on the requirements for us to have a food booth(coffee/hot chocolate/ cookies) at Triangle Park for the 3 day Labor Daze event. We supply our own booth/cover, have to staff it all 3 days, pay \$250 deposit (\$100 returned if commitment fulfilled). We would be able to sell Oktoberfest tickets. Discussion followed on difficulty of getting volunteers so close to Oktoberfest and the cost. Linda moved, Mindy seconded that we not participate this year in Labor Daze. Motion carried.

Pauli suggested that we could have a booth at Elba's Betterment Committee's Pig Roast on July 14th. We could sell Oktoberfest tickets and other items with no requirements or cost. She will look into it. Barb will refer the suggestion to the Oktoberfest committee.

Pastor's Comments:

Father thanked Mary Ann for the retreats, Deb, Rebecca, and Mindy for the decorations, everyone associated with the Holy Week/Easter celebrations, and Deacon for his assistance. Padre Pio Mass at St. Gabriel's went well, happy that we were included. We need to prepare for our celebration of the 50th anniversary of the saint's death on his Feast Day this September. Our June meeting will be at Caryville, a thank you to parish council members. There was an incident in the Oakfield parking lot where a purse was stolen from an unlocked car. It is important to be aware of security concerns. Our first payment from Upon This Rock was \$13,384.68. It paid, in part, for our elevator lift. Future payments are dependent upon continued support of parishioners honoring their pledges, and will be used to support our building and grounds projects.

Adjournment and Closing Prayer:

The meeting adjourned at 8:50pm. Linda offered the closing prayer.

Next meeting: May 22nd, at the Elba site.
