This Week's Gospel Luke 16:19-31

This Sunday's Gospel challenges us to be selfless and care for others who need help. Jesus tells a story of a poor begger names Lazarus who lived outside the gates of a Rich Man's house. Lazarus' requests for help were ignored for years. Lazarus finally found comfort in Heaven once he had died. The Rich Man passed away and went to the netherworld. The Rich Man begged Abraham for mercy just as Lazarus had once begged the Rich Man. Abraham reprimanded the Rich Man for his actions during his lifetime and for not heeding the warnings in Scripture. Jesus reminds us that we have been provided with all the resource in our lives to understand God's desire for us to serve one another. 
