### This Week's Gospel Luke 21:5-19

Jews connected the very spirit of their faith to the Temple with its incense-filled, prayerful inner courts and its shaded outer courts where people met and talked. They celebrated their holy days at the Temple, it was the center of their faith community. But Jesus' assessment of the times in this Sunday's Gospel proved accurate. The Jews rebellion against Roman occupation of the Temple in A.D. 70 by the Roman forces. When Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple to his disciples in Sunday's Gospel, they are shocked. Jesus both scares and assures his listeners, past and present. He explains that wars, disasters, and persecutions will continue in the world. He assures us that we can endure these and other troubles that occur in our lives. He promises to put words in our mouths so no one can put us down. He promises to be with us always.

### Exploring the Gospel Message as a Family

Jesus asks us not to worry when there are bad things happening in the world. Talk with your child about concerns he or she has for the world. Discuss how you deal with problems and how your faith plays a role.

### Pray Together as a Family

Make a litany prayer of all the things your family is grateful for—life, health, friends, a good home, etc. After each is mentioned, the whole family can say together: "Thanks be to God!"

October 29, 2019, Elba Site**

*We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."*

**Members in Attendance:** Father Thaddeus Bocianowski, Deacon Paul Kulczyk, Mindy Stempin, Barb Hendershott, Reg Barcomb, Linda DeVito, Diane Fiorentino, Deb Greene, Deb Armbrewster, Mary Ann Dorman, Charles Zambito, Cindy Kowalik, Deb Palone, Frank Pfalzer, Steve Harkness (Men's Group).

**Members absent:** Tom Elliot

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Barb Hendershott. The opening prayer was offered by Deacon Paul. Linda volunteered to offer the prayers at the next meeting.

**Recognition and Welcome:** Father Ted and Barb thanked members leaving council for their service, Justin Calarco-Smith, Sue Zambito, Pauli Miano, and Deb Armbrewster. They then welcomed new members, Frank Pfalzer, Deb Palone, Cindy Kowalik, and Tom Elliot.

**Minutes from the previous meeting:** Motion to approve the minutes made by Mary Ann, seconded by Diane. Motion carried.

**Open Forum:**

Mindy mentioned that she continues to get requests to change the Saturday Mass time to 4 pm. Linda reviewed for new members the questionnaire process used to select the 4:30 time, and Chuck mentioned that the time selected was a compromise between the 4 and 5 pm choices. It was noted that not everyone will be happy with any selection.

**Organization and Committee Reports:**

*Altar and Rosary* – Diane – Penny Social is November 24th, noon to 4 pm at the Elba Fireman's Recreation Hall. Help is needed for set up and clean up. A & R and Men's Group need to coordinate plans. Mary Ann Conley is chairing the Glimmer of Love event.

*Men's Group* – Steve – New officers are John Korzelius, Treasurer, and Steve Harkness, President. Mike Laycock resigned as Treasurer, after 18 years in the position. Discussions will continue about combining the financial account with the office. This is a recommendation from the Diocesan auditors that all accounts should go through the parish office. There is an estimated profit from the Pancake Breakfast of \$300. The event had a good number of people attending and all went well. Wine Tasting is on Saturday, Nov. 16<sup>th</sup>, 6:30 - 10 pm. Tickets are \$30 per couple and \$20 per individual. The event is headed up by Mike Kowalczyk.

*Bereavement* – Deb reported that the first Financial Review Board meeting had taken place. Members are Father Ted, Alice Fagnan, Judy Boyle, and Deb. They will meet on an annual basis.

**Areas of Attention:**

**Community Building:**

*Coffee Socials* – Barb – The Oktoberfest committee has requested that council consider returning to the previous format for socials, which is to have the event the last weekend of the months of May through August and drawing the Early Bird tickets at the socials. After some discussion council selected the following dates: May 31<sup>st</sup>, after 10 am Mass at Oakfield; June 28<sup>th</sup> after 8 am Mass at Elba; July 26<sup>th</sup> after 10 am Mass at Oakfield, and a Happy Hour social on August 29<sup>th</sup>, after 4:30 pm Mass at Elba.

*Share the Journey* – Mindy reported that the annual clothing giveaway went very well. Clothes were distributed to both migrant ministry participants and the community. There is no charge for the clothing. Left over clothes were donated.

*Oktoberfest* – Barb distributed the report that the committee received Monday night. Total profit is \$12583.98, about \$177 less than last year. The cash raffle was down some from last year, but basket profit was greater.

**Faith Formation:**

Mary Ann – There are 49 students in grades K – II participating this year. Catechists are mostly the same people as last year. Deacon is assisting and Mary Ann is handling the Sacraments. Catechetical Sunday was Sept. 15<sup>th</sup>, with blessing of the Catechists and the beginning of classes. On September 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Confirmation Retreat for Grades 9 – 11, was held at Camp Stella Maris in Livonia. It was a great experience for the 17 teens to learn to work together, improve communication among themselves and catechists, and develop leadership skills. On Oct. 21<sup>st</sup> Father Daniel Serbicki, Vicar of our Vicariate and Spiritual Director of St. Joseph's School met with parents and catechists. Topics were snacks at classes and ideas for planning for future activities. It was decided that the policy for snacks for students is: (1) Low sugar snacks and drinks will be given to students in grades K – 6 by catechists. (2) Drink of choice is water. (3) No drink or snack with Red dye will be given.

One of our students, Amanda Bergman, who is a member of the Diocesan Youth Board, has authored an article in the Western New York Catholic paper. She talks about her experience in a leadership role at Notre Dame High School.

**Stewardship:**

*Building and Grounds* – Reg – The window project at Oakfield is completed. The dehumidifier has been installed in the rectory in Elba and has improved the air quality. The fall preventative maintenance work is scheduled for all 5 heating systems at both sites.

**Old Business:**

*Volunteers* – Barb – At the last meeting, discussion on the need for volunteers in many areas. Kevin spoke at one of the Masses about the need. After discussion, it was noted that the best way to get additional help is the personal request. Talks from the ambo and notices in the bulletin are not as effective. Council members are encouraged to approach people personally to ask if they might want to participate in the different ministries and organizations. Greeters at all Masses is a special need at this time.

**New Business:**

*Candles* – Father explained that the cost of candles has been increasing and the asking price has remained the same for many years. He is suggesting raising the donation to \$3, from the current \$2 price. Motion by Frank, seconded by Linda, to accept the recommendation. Motion carried. Price increase will take effect in Advent.

**Pastor's Comments:**

*Kneeler* – Father reported that a parishioner has requested that a kneeler be placed in the front of the church for use by people who wish to kneel while receiving communion. This would be only in Oakfield, because there is insufficient room in Elba. The consensus of council members was that it was impractical, a tripping hazard, and would be confusing to parishioners. The standard position in the United States for receiving communion is standing, but people may opt to kneel. It was suggested that people who wish to receive communion while kneeling could step into the first pew and kneel if they wish. Diane mentioned that altar servers must kneel on the hard marble floor and asked if pads could be provided. Father and Deb will look into that.

*All Saints, All Souls* – Masses on Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>, are 8 am at Oakfield, and 6 pm at Elba. Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup>, Saturday, 4:30 pm in Oakfield.

*Stained Glass Window* – Father suggested that during Lent we ask the company repairing our windows to give a talk on the subject. We could have an evening talk and social.

**Adjournment and Closing Prayer:**

The meeting adjourned at 9 pm. Deacon offered the closing prayer.
