Children are the Living Messages we send to a Time we will not see.

This Week's Gospel: Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus asks us to go beyond treating others in the same way we want to be treated ourselves. He asks us to care for each other as God does—to love other people without expecting love in return and to even love our enemies. This is an invitation that takes a lifetime to grow into and fulfill. It is a challenge for the family to keep this message alive in a world that puts a premium on competition and on being "better".

Exploring the Gospel Message as a Family

Jesus taught us that we must love and forgive our enemies. Your child explored the call to turn the other cheek and walk the extra mile. Talk with your child about how members of the family need to forgive one another. Talk about what Jesus means when he asks that you love your enemies and to pray for those who do you harm. Discuss how important forgiveness is for the good of your family.

Pray Together as a Family

Talk, too, about how praying the Our Father can help you learn how to forgive.

February 26, 2020 The beginning of this Season of Lent

Abstinence: All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday are bound to abstain totally from meat on the fol

lowing days: Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

Fasting: All Catholics between their 18th and 59th birthdays are also bound to observe the Law of Fast on the

following days: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions

in the course of the day.

Easter Duty: After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation

of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year. This obligation may be fulfilled

between March 1 (First Sunday in Lent) and June 7 (Trinity Sunday).

The following should also be noted:

Reconciliation: Catholics are bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a

year (Canon 989).

Other Fridays of the Year: Catholics should be reminded that all other Fridays of the year remain as days of

penance, in prayerful remembrance of the Passion of Jesus Christ.

Obligation: The obligation which we have as members of the Church to do penance is a serious

one. Furthermore, the obligation t6o observe, as a whole or "substantially," the peni-

tential days specified by the Church is a serious one.

While no one should hold himself or herself lightly excused, one should not become unduly scrupulous. Failure to observe individual days of penance is less serious than the failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days.

An Invitation: In the name of peace, and in union with the Bishops of our country, the faithful of this Diocese are invited to add voluntary fasting to the practice of penance during the Fridays of the year. Together with works of charity and service toward our neighbors, this practice would become a sign of our commitment to conversion, reconciliation and peace. (The Challenge of Peace, Art. 298)


The original commitments to various parts of our Diocese remain in place, including the 35% we receive here at our parish.


