Children are the Living Messages we send to a Time we will not see.

This Week's Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9

Sunday's Gospel shows both Jesus' future and our own future. The Gospel sets our sight on Easter, just as Peter, James, and John glimpse the risen Jesus for a passing moment in the Transfiguration. Lent invites us to join Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem where he will be crucified, but also where he will rise victorious from the dead.

Exploring the Gospel Message as a Family

Your youngster learned that, painful as it may be, change and transformation is possible! Talk about Jesus' transfiguration on the mountain. What did this event show Peter, James and John? What is the promise this event has for all of us? Share together what changes you would like to see in your family.

Pray Together as a Family

As a special devotion, try to have a brief family prayer each of the remaining days of Lent. Use a favorite family prayer, pray in your own words or say one decade of the Rosary. Be sure to set a definite time for your daily prayer. Try to join in a morning prayer or an evening prayer together each day for a week. Begin and end your prayer times with the Sign of the Cross.

Census 2020—The Census Bureau conducted extensive research to understand what stops people from responding to the census and how they can be motivated to participate. As a result, the Census Bureau has undertaken a media campaign that includes television and radio commercials, social media, print advertising, and messaging on billboards and bus stops. This media effort is expected to reach 99% of all U.S. households and encourage the public to respond to the 2020 Census. The campaign has a heavy focus on encouraging participation among multicultural and hard-to-count populations, with advertising in 12 languages in addition to English. For the first time, all people living in the United States will be invited to respond to the census online. But the census questionnaire can also be completed by phone or by mail. CHANGE PRAYER PRACTICES

Prayer practices establish expectations and set the tone for your group. Examine your current prayer practices and find small ways to change them to embrace Lent. By modifying your daily prayer practices, you signal that something different is afoot. **Changes can be simple but effective.**

Begin prayer each day with a simple phrase, such as, "During this Lenten season, we pray...," or, "During Lent, we are called to turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel, and so we pray...." You might also incorporate or lengthen the silence during prayer (even if only for 30 seconds). Adding music can significantly change the spirit of prayer. Using a short, sung refrain (possibly one used in the local parish during Lent) or playing a video of reflective music brings a different dimension to prayer. A simple modification to routine can help the children recognize and enter more deeply into the Lenten season.
