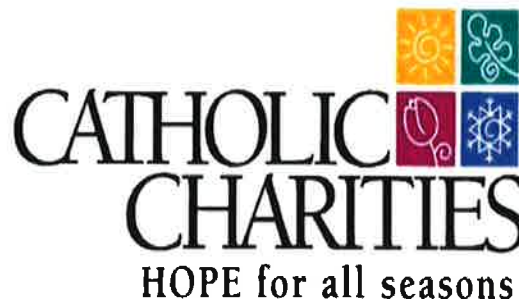
One way you can help our community is to be contributing to this year's Catholic Charities Appeal. Your donation, large or small, can bring HOPE to someone in need.

**Day 8 February 22nd-Most Just.** The virtue of just involves "giving to another his due." For example, in our relationship with God, we owe it to Him to be grateful for our existence, to praise Him for His goodness, and to have gratitude for the many ways He has blessed us. In our relationship with others, it means treating family members, friends, neighbors, co-workers, parishioners, and all people with love, dignity, and respect. Remember what Jesus says: "Do to others as you would have them do to you." (Lk 6:31)

St Joseph, Most Just, pray that I may grow in the virtue of justice. Help me to examine my life to see if I am really open to all that God wants of me. Pray the [Litany of St. Joseph](#).

**Day 9 February 23rd-Most Chaste** Put to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry. (Col 3:5)

St. Joseph, Most Chaste, pray that I may grow in the virtue of chastity. Help me to be victorious against lust and triumphant over sin. Fight for me against the wickedness and snares of the devil and help me to take refuge in you. Pray the [Litany of St. Joseph](#)

**Day 10 February 24th-Most Prudent** In every situation in life, St Joseph was a model of prudence. He prayed and waited on the Lord to reveal the mysteries of his wife's pregnancy to him. He educated the God-Man, and, in every situation, allowed prudence to govern his actions. Each time Joseph knew the will of God, he acted decisively, swiftly, and accurately. He acted neither rashly nor timidly, but prudently. Vii

**Day 11 February 25th-Most Courageous** Be strong and steadfast; have no fear or dread of them, for it is the LORD, your God, who marches with you; he will never fail you or forsake you. (Dt 31:6)

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. (Jn 14:27)

**Day 13 February 27th-Most Faithful** When a man has faith, he is in possession of something invaluable, something that acts as an impenetrable bulwark against life's suffering and trials. Think of a man of true faith whom you've encountered. Men like this are constructed from something otherworldly, almost as if they don't live by the same norms, maxims and value most commonly found among men. They have a resolve that defies what most consider reasonable. No matter the era or circumstance, a man of true faith lives with his compass directed towards God, overcoming any and all obstacles. ## *Faith Formation*

February 21

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL: Mark 1:12-15

In the Sunday Gospel, the Holy Spirit leads Jesus into the wilderness for forty days. The desert is a place of testing, but it is also a place to be close to God. Jesus' time in the desert calls us to make Lent a season of growth, a season for developing habits that will make us more loving toward God and one another.

### EXPLORING THE GOSPEL MESSAGE AS A FAMILY:

One of the most important words in our religious vocabulary is covenant. This week, your child's class learned about the covenant with Noah and how, under the sign of a rainbow, God made a new relationship with his People. During this first week of Lent, make a family covenant- an agreement to spend the season doing good things for others, making personal and family sacrifices, and praying together as a family. It would be good to put your family covenant in writing.

### PRAY TOGETHER AS A FAMILY:

An important part of the Lenten discipline is prayer. When you complete your conversation about Sunday's Gospel lesson, some evening during a family meal, share a special prayer that your forty days of Lent will help your family grow in the love of God and love of others too. Ask each family member to say a prayer in his or her own words.

A "Joint Parish St. Joseph Retreat: Living with Jesus during Lent" will be held at 7 pm on Thursdays from February 18 through March 18 at St. Leo the Great, 885 Sweet Home Rd., Amherst. The devotional event includes multiple speakers, hymns to St. Joseph, sacred art commentary on St. Joseph's life, and prayers for entrustment to St. Joseph – towards the indulgence offered for the Year of St. Joseph. 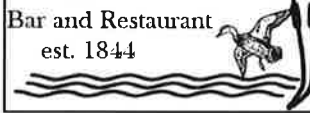
