## Faith Formation

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL: Mark 11:1-10  
Palm Sunday celebrates Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and the start of Holy Week. The mysteries of Holy Week are focused on the Sacred Triduum- the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Holy Saturday celebration of the Easter Vigil. This Sunday, we proclaim two Gospels- Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and the entire story of the Passion and Death of Jesus according to Mark's Gospel.

### EXPLORING THE GOSPEL MESSAGE AS A FAMILY:

This week, your child's class learned of all the events in the final days of Jesus' life. Ask your child to share with the family what the days of Palm, Sunday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday celebrate. Talk together about what it means that Jesus suffered and died for you and for the whole world. Be sure to display the palm branches you received at Mass.

### PRAY TOGETHER AS A FAMILY,

One of the elements of the Good Friday liturgy is the adoration of the cross. Every Catholic home should prominently display a cross or a crucifix. Pray together prayer from the liturgy. Leader: "Behold the wood of the Cross, on which hung the salvation of the world." ALL respond: "Come let us adore." If possible, pass the crucifix from one family member to the next. Each family member can then gently kiss the crucifix. When alpha e adored the cross, repeat the prayer. Conclude by making a reverent Sign of the Cross

# How to Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet



The Chaplet is Prayed on a five-decade Rosary

## 1. Make the Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

## 2. Our Father

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

## 3. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

## 4. The Apostle's Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father

almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

## 5. The Eternal Father

**Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.**

## 6. On the Ten Small Beads of Each Decade

**For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.**

## 7. Repeat for the remaining decades

Saying the "Eternal Father" (5) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (6) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

## 8. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)

**Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.**

**Eternal God in whom mercy is endless  
and the treasure of compassion is inexhaustible,  
look kindly upon us and increase your mercy in us.  
That in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent.  
But with great confidence submit ourselves to Your Holy Will which is  
Love & Mercy itself.**



## The Divine Mercy Novena

In a vision, Sister Faustina learned that God blessed the Earth in consideration of His Son. She wrote, "I saw a great light with God the Father in the center. Between the light and the Earth I saw Jesus nailed on the cross in such a way that God, wishing to look at the Earth, had to do it through the wounds of Our Lord." (I,24)

"At three in the afternoon, implore my Mercy, especially for sinners. And although it only be for a brief instant, imbibe yourself in My Passion, especially in my abandonment at that of My Agony. This the moment of great Mercy for the world. At that moment nothing will be denied to the soul that implores Me through the merits of My Passion." (IV, 59)

### Brief Prayer for three o'clock in the afternoon

"You died, Jesus, but Your death caused a spring of life for all souls, and the ocean of Your Mercy flooded the whole world. Oh, Fountain of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, flood the whole world, pouring out on us even Your last drop." (IV, 59)

"Oh, Blood and Water that sprang from the Heart of Jesus, source of Mercy for us, I trust in You."

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on **Good Friday**. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said:

"These souls cause Me more suffering than any other; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy."

In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her:

"On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy.....On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

The different souls prayed for on each day of the novena are:

<u>Day 1 (Good Friday)</u>	All mankind, especially sinners
<u>Day 2 (Holy Saturday)</u>	The souls of priests and religious
<u>Day 3 (Easter Sunday)</u>	All devout and faithful souls
<u>Day 4 (Easter Monday)</u>	Those who do not believe in Jesus and those who do not yet know Him
<u>Day 5 (Easter Tuesday)</u>	The souls of separated brethren
<u>Day 6 (Easter Wednesday)</u>	The meek and humble souls and the souls of children
<u>Day 7 (Easter Thursday)</u>	The souls who especially venerate and glorify Jesus' mercy
<u>Day 8 (Easter Friday)</u>	The souls who are detained in purgatory
<u>Day 9 (Easter Saturday)</u>	The souls who have become lukewarm

**During the Solemn Novena leading to Divine Mercy Sunday  
should be offered each day for the day's intention.**

The Polish people are very religious. Most of them are Roman Catholics. For centuries, during the 40 days before Easter - called Lent - the Polish people fasted. This means they ate no meat, butter, eggs, cheese or desserts. So a big part of the Easter celebration was being able to eat these foods again.

On the day before Easter - called Holy Saturday - women prepared baskets and filled them with a little bit of each of the foods they would eat on Easter morning. In the basket they placed Polish sausage, ham, bacon, and decorated eggs - called *pisanki* (pee-sawn-key). From butter, they carved a lamb, which symbolized Jesus Christ, holding a banner with a cross on it. The basket also contained a round loaf of bread with a cross cut into the crust, some cheese, horseradish, salt and a candle.

The food basket was covered with a pretty cloth and the handle of the basket was decorated with colorful flowers, including pussy willows, which are a symbol of Easter in Poland. The basket was brought to the church where a priest prayed over the baskets and sprinkled them with holy water to bless the food. After the blessing, the basket was taken home and set aside until Easter morning.

On Easter morning the family attended church. When they get home, the head of the house took one of the blessed eggs, removed the shell and cut it into small pieces to share it among all the people in the family. The blessed egg is the symbol of life and eating it was believed to guarantee good health. Everyone exchanged wishes and they ate a big meal that included soup, all the blessed foods in, the basket plus other foods and desserts. Everyone had to eat at least a small piece of each of the blessed foods because this would bring them good luck.



**Maslo** (butter) This favorite dairy product is often shaped into a lamb (*Baranek Wielkanocny*) or a cross. This reminds us of the goodness of Christ that we should have toward all things.

**Babka** (Easter bread) - A round loaf topped with a cross or a fish, symbolic of Jesus, who is our true Bread of Life.

**Chrzan** (horseradish with grated red beets) - Symbolic of the Passion of Christ still in our minds but sweetened with some sugar because of the Resurrection.

**Jajka** (eggs) and **Pisanki** (decorated with the symbols of Easter, of life, of prosperity) - Indicate new life and Christ's Resurrection from the tomb.

**Kielbasa** (sausage) - A spicy sausage of pork products, indicative of God's favor and generosity.

**Szynka** (ham) - Symbolic of great joy and abundance. Some prefer lamb or veal. The lamb also reminds Catholics that the Risen Christ is the "Lamb of God."

**Slonina** (smoked bacon) - A symbol of the over abundance of God's mercy and generosity.

**Sól** (salt) - So necessary an element in our physical life, that Jesus used its symbolism: "You are the salt of the earth."

**Ser** (cheese) - Shaped into a ball, it is the symbol of the moderation Christians should have at all times.

A **candle** is inserted into the basket to represent Christ, the Light of the World. A colorful ribbon and sometimes sprigs of greenery are attached. A linen cover is drawn over the top and it is ready for the priest's visit or for the trek to church where it is joined with the baskets of others to await the blessing that will render it fit for consumption on Easter Sunday.

Beginning in 2015, [The Foundation of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y., Inc.](#) ("Foundation") began soliciting donations to its "Upon this Rock" ("UTR") capital and endowment campaign. The UTR campaign raised funds for many purposes, including soliciting funds for making essential upgrades to classroom facilities and technology of Christ the King Seminary ("CKS"), expanding CKS's role as a center of retreat and religious celebration, and establishing an endowment fund for CKS. Unfortunately, in early 2020, CKS's Board of Trustees determined that CKS would close at the end of the 2020-2021 academic year. CKS's closure will make it impossible for the Foundation to use the UTR funds raised for CKS for their original intended purposes. However, under New York law, when the original purposes for which funds are donated become impossible to achieve, those purposes can be modified in a manner consistent with original intent by the New York State courts. For many years, CKS provided education and formation for ordained and lay ecclesial ministers in the Diocese of Buffalo and beyond. Accordingly, the Foundation has asked the New York State Supreme Court for the County of Erie to approve a modification of the purposes of UTR funds raised for CKS so that those funds can be used to support the education and formation for ordained and lay ecclesial ministry in the Diocese of Buffalo, [as determined in the discretion of the Foundation's Board.](#)

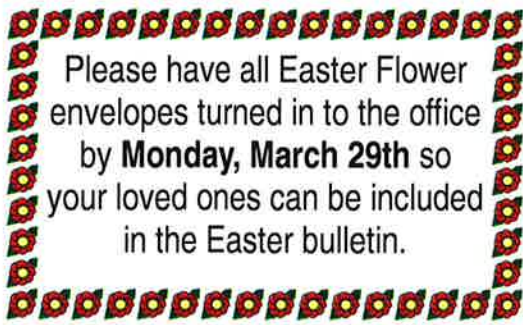

In order for your submission to be available for the Court's consideration, please be sure to send any letter or email, or make any filing, no later than Friday, April 9, 2021.

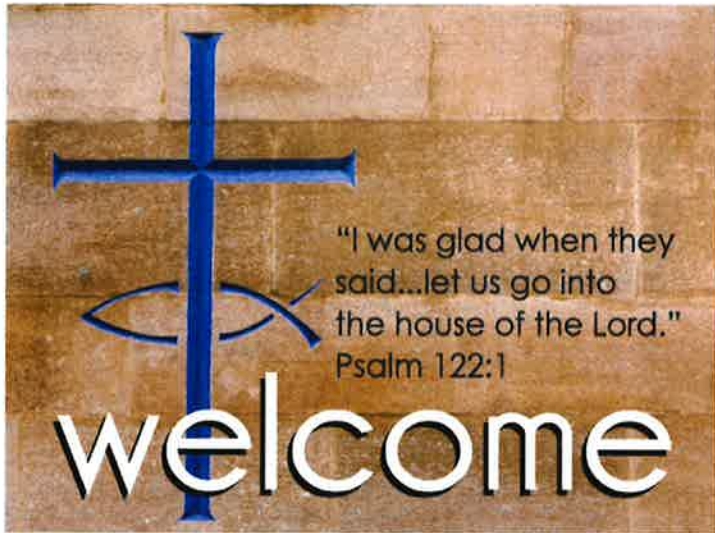
