
Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament is offered on request. Please contact the church office for anointing.




Dear Blessed Mother,

In the Gospel of John we hear; "May all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me."

The individualism of our culture has resulted in a failure to recognize our striving for the common good, and our connection to the human race. Our lack of recognizing all as part of the Body of Christ has become a knot in our church.

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL: Mark 12:28b-34

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus gives us his New Law: Love God's and love your neighbor. This Great Commandment sums up Jesus' teaching that love is what connects us to God and all other people. It sounds easy, but living the Law of Love takes great effort and prayer. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we can follow Jesus' Great Commandments.

EXPLORING the GOSPEL MESSAGE:

Your child learned about the importance of love. He or she also learned many practical ways to show love to God. Invite your child to share some of the ways we show love for God and others. As a family, recite the prayer titled, "My Thank-You Prayer."

PRAY TOGETHER:

This Sunday's Gospel is about Jesus' Great Commandments to love God and love our neighbors. In giving the Great Commandment, Jesus cites one of Israel's oldest creeds. Read the passage from Deuteronomy 6:4-5. Pray as a family by praising and thanking God. Be sure that each family member has a chance to contribute to the prayer. Keep the prayer in mind as you show God's love to others in your life this week.

GOSPEL TABLE TALK:

- * Do you think the scribe was expecting Jesus to answer the question about the commandments with so much wisdom and knowledge?
- * Take a few moments in silence to ponder how you would complete each of the following statements: "I try to show how much I love God when I ..." and "I think I could try harder to show I love my neighbor by ...".
- * Ask family members to share the thoughts that came to their mind each statement.
