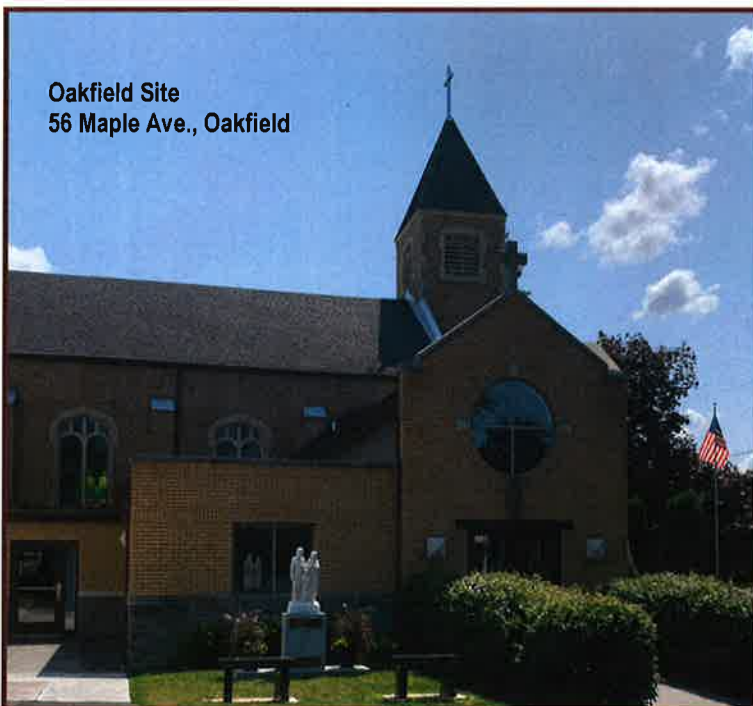

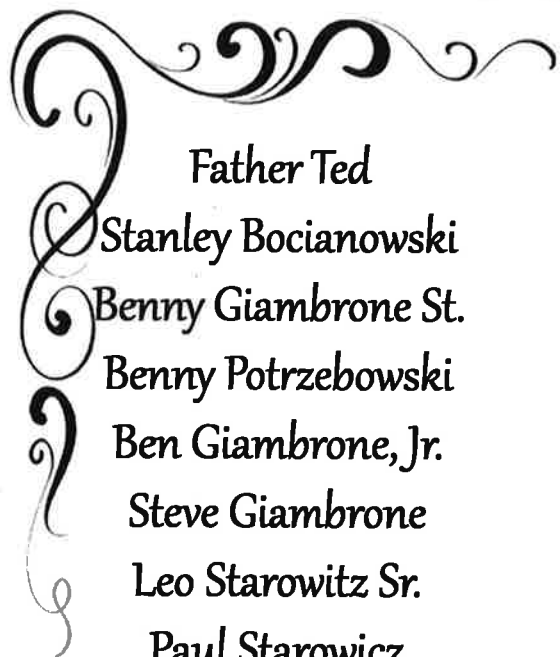

Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill
Introducing our newest Mission Work in Pedro Carbo,
Guayaquil, Ecuador

The Mission: In 2010 the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill Korean Province celebrated 50 years in Korea. In gratitude for the Lord's blessings in South Korea and their mission in Yanji, China (1996) started a new mission in a poor area of Ecuador which consists of taking over a clinic, a school for children with disabilities and assisting with parish work.



The Missionaries: Of the thirty-seven sisters who volunteered for this work, four sisters were chosen to go to Ecuador. These four sisters attended an intensive course for new missionaries offered by the Columban Fathers in Seoul. In preparation for the Golden Jubilee of the Korean Province, the sisters arrived in Guayaquil in March 2008 and studied Spanish at the Catholic University, Universidad Catolica De Santiago De Guayaquil, for a year. After the completion of their formal language studies they moved to Pedro Carbo. Many people comment on the joy and peace these sisters bring to this area. It is a mission of hope and sharing deeply the love of the Lord. One of the sisters said, "Even though I am living in a different culture and a different land I believe that the Lord's love is strong and will help us become one with the people."

The Project: Sending missionaries to the poor in the world has always been stressed in religious communities. The Korean Bishops' Conference urged religious communities of men and women in Korea to share the blessings they have received with poorer countries of the world. Even though there are many needs in the Korean Province, we wanted to respond to the call to go to the small town of Pedro Carbo in the Archdiocese of Guayaquil, Ecuador in order to minister to children who are physically and mentally challenged and to assume administration of a small clinic, Clinica de Nuestra Senora de Merced.

Father Herbert Levthner, an Austrian diocesan priest and Ms. Elizabeth Kim, a Korean member of the secular institute Auxilium founded these two facilities and worked here for ten years before the sisters assumed the responsibility.

Since Elizabeth and Father Leuthner knew they would be retiring in 2009, Elizabeth invited the Sisters to come to Pedro Carbo to assume responsibility for the two facilities and also to minister in the local parish which has 50 mission stations and only one pastor.

When the sisters first met the people in the area and experienced their warmth and welcome their hearts burned with the desire to “stay” with them. The area of Pedro Carbo is very poor. There are a large number of children who are physically and mentally challenged in need of education and training and the sisters were happy to take over this very special work. The clinic was originally started because many of the mothers were dying at childbirth. Now it has grown and there are more departments in the clinic to help individuals with other health problems. The clinic provides services to all in the area and the patients at Clinica de Nuestra Senora de Merced are treated with dignity and respect.

One Minute Meditations

Take your rightful place

As a baptized Catholic, your parish is your home by right.

As such, you have the right to a seat at your parish table.

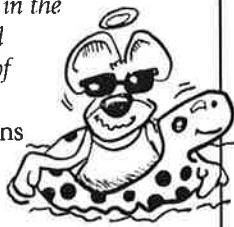


You take it when you attend weekend Mass, and seek peace from sacraments such as the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Holy Matrimony.

Times change; God doesn't

The Bible tells of countless times when God gave his people victory in otherwise hopeless circumstances, provided for them when they had no resources, and guided them in their decisions. God is ready to work as powerfully for you.

"Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' (this is the first commandment with a promise), 'that it may be well with you and that you may live long on the earth.' Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:1-4).



God waits for our "Yes"

God loves us and wants us to be happy with Him in Heaven forever, but He won't force Himself on us. Out of respect for our free will, God asks that we cooperate with His grace to save us, but leaves it up to us to say, "Yes!"

Cultivate your faith. The better we know our Catholic Faith the easier it is to know how to live it. The Catechism of the Catholic Church summarizes all major teachings of the Catholic Church. Read an article in it each day and learn a new term from the glossary weekly. Then, there will be no guessing about what Catholics believe.

Keep your conscience in shape.

A well-formed conscience signals us when a choice is virtuous (good) or sinful (bad). Review what the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes require. Meditate on the examples of Jesus and Mary in the Gospels and how your behavior compares.

Stay close to the Sacraments. Through the Sacraments we directly encounter Christ. Attend Confession monthly and

Mass at least weekly. This is the best way to stay close to God and His Heart.

Perform Works of Mercy. God uses these opportunities to conform us more fully to Christ. Find ways to serve your parish in time, resources, or gifts. It is Jesus who ultimately receives our gift (Matthew 25:40).



Why Do Catholics Do That?

Why do Catholics use the different titles when we address the clergy?

After Jesus ascended, the Church grew so quickly that the spiritual needs of the Christian community demanded a global hierarchy of clergy to minister to them while maintaining the unity of the Faith. In response, the Apostles ordained deacons to assist so they could



focus on liturgy (Acts 6:2-4).

Today, there are different titles for different roles and levels of authority. For example, we are most likely to encounter

priests ("Father"), deacons, and bishops ("Your Excellency," or "Your Grace").
