
Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament is offered on request. Please contact the church office for anointing.

This week's Gospel: Luke 23:35-43

For the Solemnity of Christ the King, the *Lectionary* chooses a short passage from Luke's account of Jesus' Passion. The Passion depicts Jesus without physical or military power, yet he is dangerous enough to be put to death.

As his opponents tease and taunt him, Jesus shows his divine power in forgiving a criminal on a cross near him. This man recognizes his own wrongdoing and truly believes that Jesus can help him get to Heaven. By this action of faith, Jesus transforms the Cross from a place of death to a place of life and forgiveness.

Pray Together

Every family experiences the need for forgiveness. Spend a few moments together sharing things for which each member of the family is sorry.

Then ask God for forgiveness and ask one another for forgiveness as well. In your family prayer, remember all those who suffer injustice throughout the world.

End by praying the Our Father together.

St. Padre Pio Parish Unapproved Council Minutes November 3, 2022, 7:00 pm, Oakfield site

We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."

Members in Attendance: Father Thaddeus Bocianowski, Deacon Paul Kulczyk, Reg Barcomb, Linda DeVito, Linda Giambrone (for Diane Fiorentino), Mary Ann Dorman, Mindy Stempin, Steve Harkness, Cindy Kowalik, Jackie Davis, Jackie Motz, Jim Coffta, Mary Moscicki, Tim McKenrick.

Members absent: Debbie Palone, Diane Fiorentino.

Cindy called the meeting to order at 7 pm. Father Ted offered prayers for the repose of the soul of parishioner, Dorothy Allen, who died today.

Minutes from the previous meeting: Motion to approve the minutes from August 16th made by Tim, seconded by Jackie D. Motion carried.

Organization and Committee Reports:

Altar and Rosary – Linda G. – On October 15th, we hosted a Meet and Greet in Elba with members of societies dedicated to Mary, from our family of parishes. It was attended by 45 people. The Rosary was recited before the 4:30 pm Mass and a light luncheon was served afterwards. Pauli Miano described the history of the shrine. The Penny Social will be held at the Elba Fire Hall on November 20th. We are accepting new and gently used items that can be brought to the conference room or left in the Elba hall. The Men's group will assist with set up and break down. There is a need for volunteers on the day of the event. The jewelry drive will continue through November. A \$200 donation was made to St. Luke's Mission of Mercy for Thanksgiving food. The Glimmer of Love Mass will be on December 3rd; information will be in the pews beginning this weekend.

Men's Group – Steve – The Pancake Breakfast will be on November 13th, from 9 to noon.

We purchased 4 boxwood bushes that were planted on the Maple Ave. side of the church in Oakfield by Reg, Terry Martino and Bob Funke. We attempted to contact any Men's Groups in our family of parishes, but have not received a response. Our next meeting is Monday, November 14th, 7 pm.

Music Ministry – Linda G. reported that two new people have joined the choir, one had been a previous member. This was in response to our request for new members.

Faith Formation:

Mary Ann – On October 23rd, our Day of Service, the Faith Formation students loaded the food donations into vehicles and took them to the GOOSE. In order to assist the staff

there, the students and parents then placed the items on the shelves. To celebrate All Saints Day, at the family gathering on October 30th, the students dressed up as saints for Mass. Afterwards they gathered in the hall with their parents and grandparents to tell about their saints. Students and parents wrote letters and drew pictures to include in the College Freshmen Survival Exam packages that were sent this week.

We will be working with the GOOSE to obtain names for the Giving Tree this year. I attended an informational meeting regarding the Pillar of Forming Disciples, from the Road to Renewal playbook, as the Faith Formation representative of the parish. This playbook can be accessed on the Buffalo Diocese website, under Renewal Resources.

Stewardship:

Building and Grounds – Reg – Restoration of the Oakfield sacristy roof gable has been completed. Replacement of the bell tower roof and louvers has been rescheduled for the spring of 2023. The partially functioning stove and older refrigerator in the Oakfield rectory have been replaced. Father Ted expressed gratitude to Ben's Appliances for the donation and assistance with this matter.

The roof of the Elba community room needs replacement within the next year. The roof is 20 to 25 years old and has shown recent leaking along the eaves on the westerly side and some comprised shingles throughout.

Old Business:

Road to Renewal – Cindy – The timing of our participation has changed several times. Current date to begin is May 1, 2023. A meeting with the Diocesan priests and the Bishop last month indicated a number of problems with the process. Additional meetings were held afterwards, but no report has been forthcoming. Communication from the Diocese to the Renewal representatives has been inconsistent. Hannah M. Beuler has volunteered to work with Cindy as our representatives.

Goals for the parish developed from parish wide survey – Cindy – The committee of Father, Deacon, Mindy, Mary Ann, Linda, and Cindy met and is proposing two goals based on results of the parish wide survey:

First: A series of discussions for adults on the weekly gospels will be presented on a monthly basis by Deacon, in coordination with Faith Formation. At least 25 parishioners will attend a minimum of 6 sessions by June, 2024, which will assist them in discussing their Catholic faith. The first of these sessions will be on December 11th, after the 10 am Mass.

Second: The devotions of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and the Recitation of the Rosary will be available once each month. Attendance will increase by 50% by June, 2024. These devotions are ongoing, Adoration is after mass on the first Friday each month, and the Rosary is said before the 4:30 pm mass on each first Saturday of the month.

New Business:

Rectory in Elba — Father Ted shared a letter from Earl Roth, president of the Elba Historical Society, requesting use of the Elba Rectory for the storage and utilization of records. The vast number of records are currently held by the town, who has requested the society assume custody, but the society does not have sufficient space to store the items. Discussion on this request included an interest in utilizing the rectory, but concerns regarding insurance, cost, Diocesan approval, and other issues followed. A motion for a committee of Tim, Reg, Deacon, and Father to meet with Mr. Roth, contact the Diocese, and investigate the matter. Then to report their findings to council at our next meeting was made by Linda, seconded by Steve. Motion carried.

Pastor's Comments:

Christmas masses will be the same as previous years, Christmas Eve, 4 pm in Oakfield and 9 pm in Elba. Christmas Day, 10 am, Oakfield. John Korzelius installed a program to activate the bells in Oakfield. Father will be working with Linda G. to select songs for the Advent season.

Adjournment and Closing Prayer:

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 pm. Deacon offered a special prayer to St. Gertrude for the souls in purgatory.
