
Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament is offered on request. Please contact the church office for anointing.

This Week's Gospel: Matthew 5:38-48



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Next Wednesday, the Church enters into the Holy Season of Lent. This important time begins with Ash Wednesday and the reception of ashes on our foreheads as a sign of humility and penance. Lent calls us to focus on acts of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving along with a renewed effort to discover the Lord more deeply in the scriptures. Lent also calls us to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully.

Many follow the instruction of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. This year Saint Patrick's Day falls on Friday, a traditional day to abstain from eating meat. Recognizing the spiritual and the cultural significance of Saint Patrick's Day I hereby grant a commutation of the discipline of abstaining from meat on March 17, 2023.

A commutation of this discipline means that those Catholics who choose to eat meat on Friday, March 17th are obliged to choose another day before March 24, 2023 to abstain from eating meat.

I hope this allows for a joyful celebration of Saint Patrick and Irish heritage, by blood or association, for all who find this day meaningful.

May the love and protection, Saint Patrick can give, be yours in abundance, as long as you live. Saint Patrick, pray for us.




