
Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament is offered on request. Please contact the church office for anointing.



St. Padre Pio Parish Unapproved Council Minutes October 3, 2023, 7:00 pm, Oakfield site

We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."

Guests: Rev. Scottston Brentwood, Rev. Mathew Zirnheld, Rev. Patrick O'Keefe 17 parishioners attended who are not members of council.

Cindy called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Father Ted offered the opening prayer. The usual order of business will not be followed for this meeting. Father Scott Brentwood, the Moderator of our Family of Parishes will present an overview of the situation and address our concerns.

Overview:

Father Scott is a member of the Order of Mercy, whose members serve both in this country and in others. His superior is located in Rome, but he also answers to the Bishop of the Diocese of Buffalo. In the diocese he serves on a number of committees, and is Pastor of Our Lady of Mercy Parish in Leroy and St. Brigid Parish in Bergen. He speaks 6 languages and has served in Rome, and in other locations. The Mercedarian Friars have been serving in Buffalo since 1943, and when the Road to Renewal was announced there was a question if the Order should continue here. Father Scott advocated for that to continue. While he is the Moderator of the family, Father Matt is the Pastor, so the priests will work "in solidum", meaning they work together. The particular issue in this family is the distance between sites. Leroy to Bergen is 10 minutes, to Batavia 15 minutes, to Oakfield 30 minutes. Because of this, he expects that Father Matt and Father Pat will be the primary priests to serve Padre Pio Parish, but when necessary he will come. We will move slowly in this Road to Renewal process, taking 3 to 5 years. He and Father Matt need to learn about the area before decisions are made.

Administration:

Office/rectory — Father Scott will monitor the payment of bills. He will work with Jackie to develop a process for checks to be signed combined with online payments. It is doubtful that anyone will live in the rectory, not impossible, but unlikely. Masses/Sick Calls/Funerals - The schedule for weekend and weekday masses will be addressed later in conjunction with those for the whole family. Priests will be discussing the best way to assign. Funerals, burials, etc. will be arranged through the office with Father Matt. When sick calls are needed, Father Matt or Father Pat

should be called. It is important to give as much lead time as possible. In addition, if someone is in the hospital in Batavia, Father Matt should be notified. If he or Father Pat is seeing someone else, they could stop and see that person. If someone is in a Rochester hospital, Father Scott should be called.

Sacraments – A priest will be available for 1st Communion, 1st Reconciliation. Mary Ann should work with Father Matt to determine dates. Deacons can be utilized for Baptisms. Father Scott described some of the devotions and schedule for confessions at Our Lady of Mercy, and emphasized their importance. An example of working together, marriage prep could be scheduled in one or two locations instead of in each parish.

Role of Deacons — There will be a need for Deacons to expand their role, and the laity to be more involved. Deacon Paul was asked if he would remain in the parish. He explained that Deacons are first assigned to their home parishes, and then expected to move to other parishes every few years. His supervisor has indicated that he needs to move to another assignment.

Faith Formation: Mary Ann described some of the issues. The diocese wants her to change her curriculum. There is a need to schedule the retreats and needs a priest to attend. She said that working with Leroy was positive, especially for the high school students. Father said he would support her choices in curriculum and assured her that the retreats would be scheduled.

Building and Grounds: Reg described some of the work in progress, replacing the roof of the shrine in Elba, installing turbine vents and roof repair on the rectory also in Elba. He described the Oakfield glass window frame restoration project that began in 2013. Three of the six stages are completed; the 4th is nearing completion now (the louver and window in belfry tower). The next stage is the stained glass windows on the cemetery side of the church. The funds are available, and much of the work is done by volunteers. Father Scott said to proceed with the work, it is important to maintain our buildings.

Over a year ago, the Elba Historical Society asked to lease space in the Elba rectory for storage of materials. A committee met with a representative from the diocese to evaluate the proposal. He submitted the request to the diocese, who said that no decision should be made until the family was operational. Earl Roth, of EHS, said that he has looked for other options. Reg will meet with him to determine if there is still interest and forward any plans to Father Scott.

Church Groups: Parish Council and Finance Council should continue to meet. Eventually a Family Council will be established. Other groups should continue. Road to Renewal: A bulletin insert on the Pillars will be sent to each parish for inclusion in the Oct.14/15 bulletins, asking parishioners to consider being a part of for future family building. One or two people from each parish will be selected for each pillar. No one should be on more than one pillar, so that there are a variety of opinions. Also, there will be a lot of work for each one. The diocese is scheduling meetings/workshops for all of the trustees this month.

Other: Father Matt contributed to the conversations. He indicated that "nothing was written in stone". He has attended a number of diocesan meetings where changes are constant. He said that they had 40 funerals in Batavia since June when he arrived, showing the changes in the parishes. He and Father Scott agreed that the bankruptcy of the diocese has caused a number of changes in policy.

Adjournment and Closing Prayer:

Deacon Paul led a closing prayer and the meeting adjourned at 9:20 pm. **Respectively submitted,** Linda DeVito, Secretary


