
Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament is offered on request. Please contact the church office for anointing.



"Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the Scriptures?"

Dear Brother in Christ,

I beg for your assistance in promoting World Mission Sunday, which the Church will celebrate worldwide on October 22. From the humble chapel in Khandamal, India, to your parish, Catholics around the globe participate in this universal solidarity moment.

Pope Pius XI instituted World Mission Sunday in 1926, and the first worldwide collection occurred the following year. Held each year on the penultimate Sunday in October, World Mission Sunday is an effort of the entire Church to help over 1,100 dioceses that cannot sustain themselves because they are too poor, young, or actively persecuted.

Until 1908, the Church in the United States was a mission territory. We relied on this fund to build our churches and seminaries and support our clergy and religious. Today many foreign missions rely on our generosity to sustain the Church, which is an instrument of God's love and mercy, His hope and peace.

May I impose upon you to hang the accompanying poster in a prominent place in your parish to remind your parishioners of our shared missionary vocation and to learn about the work of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith? We all are responsible for praying for the Church, where Christ's redeeming message has yet to be heard, forgotten, rejected, or shunned.

Tens of thousands of missionary women and men, priests, religious and laity, rely on our prayers every day, not only on World Mission Sunday. These missionaries are building churches, educating children, and healing the wounds caused by war, cruelty, oppression, terror, and despair. With our daily prayer and our generous donation on World Mission Sunday, we all bear witness to the compassion of our Lord Jesus Christ, making Him present in every continent, country, city, family, and heart.

This year's message from Pope Francis for World Mission Sunday, "Hearts on fire, feet on the move," is inspired by our Lord's encounter with the disciples on the Road to Emmaus found in the Gospel of Luke (24:13-35). In choosing this theme, Pope Francis has reaffirmed that World Mission Sunday is a privileged opportunity to us foster missionary cooperation on both the spiritual and material levels.

Were your eyes opened and is "your heart on fire" after encountering Jesus in the Eucharist? Will you take the risk of faith to invite everyone to walk together on the path of peace and salvation?



Hearts on fire, feet on the move



"Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" Luke 24:13

This Year's Theme: "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move"

Pope Francis invites us to set our hearts ablaze with faith and put our faith into action, serving God's mission with joy, enthusiasm, and tireless dedication.

"Hearts on Fire"

As Christians, we're called to kindle the fire of Christ's love in our hearts. Our burning faith fuels our actions, inspiring us to serve others in our daily lives.

"Feet on the Move"

Pope Francis encourages us to not only feel the faith but to act on it. It's our mission to move, serve, and spread the Good News, bringing God's love and peace to all His children.

What is World Mission Sunday?

World Mission Sunday is an annual global celebration within the Catholic Church, observed on the second to last Sunday of October. This special day is dedicated to the support of the missionary work of the Church through prayer and sacrifices.

Why Do We Celebrate It?

Established by Pope Pius XI in 1926, World Mission Sunday is an opportunity for every Church community worldwide to express solidarity with our brothers and sisters living in mission territories. The collection supports mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe.

How to take part:

Prayers: Pray for the success of the Church's missionary efforts, missionary priests, religious brothers and sisters, and lay people. And also pray for the people served by them in Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Pacific Islands, and some regions of Europe.

Donations: Your financial support helps fund missionary activities around the world, such as:

- -Training future priests and religious
- -Supporting religious Sisters
- -Empowering catechists teaching the faith
- -Funding clinics for the sick and dying
- -Providing homes for orphaned children





WORLD MISSION SUNDAY Hearts on fire, feet on the move

Did you know?

The Society for the Propagation of the Faith, one of four Pontifical Mission Societies, was founded by French laywoman Blessed Pauline Jaricot in 1822. She planted the seed for what today is the World Mission Sunday Collection by asking her friends to pray daily and donate a penny a week for the missionaries working on spreading the Gospel to all nations.

The monies raised in 1822 supported the vast diocese of Louisiana, which then extended from the Florida Keys to Canada, as well as the missions of Kentucky and China. In the United States, we benefited from the collection until 1908. Throughout the years, we received the equivalent of over \$250 million today, while the dioceses in our country considered mission territories have continued to receive subsidies.

Fairbanks, Alaska, was the last of those dioceses and received its final subsidy payment this year!

Offerings support the formation of seminarians and religious men and women, assist in the construction of churches, schools, and orphanages, and help missionaries proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.


Pray the rosary for the missions this October!

The World Mission Rosary is a tool used to both pray and speak about the missions. Its uniqueness is in the five colors represented in each of the decades.

This rosary honors the work of mission, our call to be missioners, and fosters peace through its special emphasis on each of the Earth's regions where prayers are needed for all people who live and play and pray just like each of us!

The mysteries of the World Mission Rosary are the ones you know-joyful, sorrowful, glorious, and of light. Each color, however, represents an area in particular:

- Green for the forests and grasslands of Africa
- Red calling to mind the fire of faith that brought missionaries to the Americas (US, Canada, Latin America, and Native Americans)
- White symbolizing Europe, the home of the Holy Father
- Blue for the ocean surrounding the Islands of the Pacific (Australia/Oceania)
- Yellow symbolizing the morning light of the East and the "beginning of civilization" for Asia/Middle East


