
Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament is offered on request. Please contact the church office for anointing.



This Sunday's Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

In the Gospel, Jesus uses another parable set in a vineyard that again represents Israel and its people. The landowner plants the vines and hires tenants to work the vineyard for him. At harvest time, they kill the landowner's servants in order to keep the crops for themselves. They even kill his son when he comes to collect the owner's share. Jesus wants the leaders in Israel to take good care of the people and not deprive them of what is rightfully theirs. This week is a good opportunity to explore with your family how to be good members of the various groups you belong to—most importantly, your family and the Church.

When you complete your conversation about this Sunday's Gospel lesson, sit quietly together, hold hands, and pray the Lord's Prayer together. When the prayer is finished, invite each family member to say a short prayer in his or her own words.

Dear Brother in Christ,

I beg for your assistance in promoting World Mission Sunday, which the Church will celebrate worldwide on October 22. From the humble chapel in Khandamal, India, to your parish, Catholics around the globe participate in this universal solidarity moment.

Pope Pius XI instituted World Mission Sunday in 1926, and the first worldwide collection occurred the following year. Held each year on the penultimate Sunday in October, World Mission Sunday is an effort of the entire Church to help over 1,100 dioceses that cannot sustain themselves because they are too poor, young, or actively persecuted.

Until 1908, the Church in the United States was a mission territory. We relied on this fund to build our churches and seminaries and support our clergy and religious. Today many foreign missions rely on our generosity to sustain the Church, which is an instrument of God's love and mercy, His hope and peace.

May I impose upon you to hang the accompanying poster in a prominent place in your parish to remind your parishioners of our shared missionary vocation and to learn about the work of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith? We all are responsible for praying for the Church, where Christ's redeeming message has yet to be heard, forgotten, rejected, or shunned.

Tens of thousands of missionary women and men, priests, religious and laity, rely on our prayers every day, not only on World Mission Sunday. These missionaries are building churches, educating children, and healing the wounds caused by war, cruelty, oppression, terror, and despair. With our daily prayer and our generous donation on World Mission Sunday, we all bear witness to the compassion of our Lord Jesus Christ, making Him present in every continent, country, city, family, and heart.


This year's message from Pope Francis for World Mission Sunday, "Hearts on fire, feet on the move," is inspired by our Lord's encounter with the disciples on the Road to Emmaus found in the Gospel of Luke (24:13-35).
