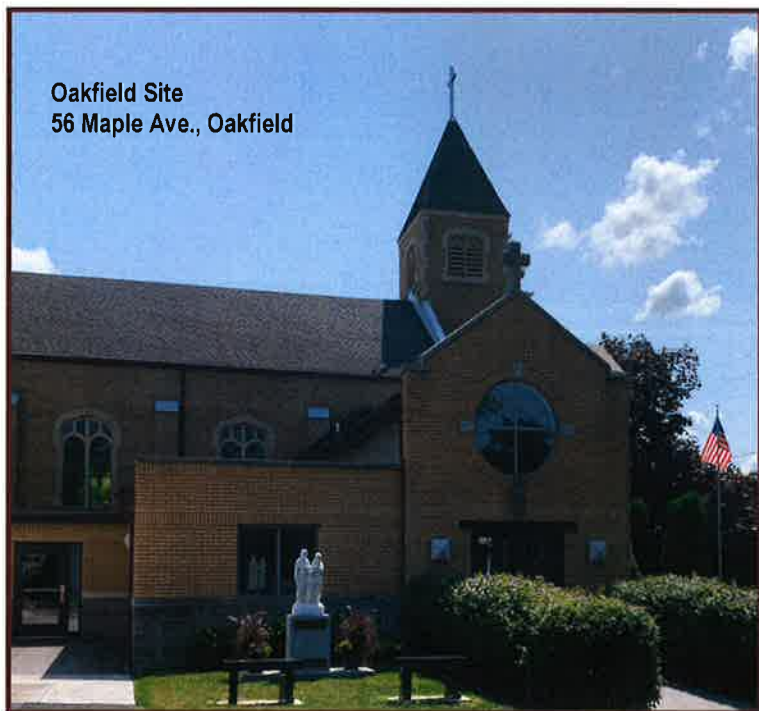

St. Padre Pio Parish Unapproved Council Minutes
February 15 2024, 7:00 pm, Oakfield site

We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."

Members in Attendance: Rev. Scottston Brentwood, Rev. Matthew Zirnheld, Rev. Patrick O'Keefe, Reg Barcomb, Linda DeVito, Steve Harkness, Cindy Kowalik, Jackie Davis, Jim Coffta, Mary Ann Dorman, Mary Moscicki, Jackie Motz.

Members absent: Debbie Palone, Deacon Paul Kulczyk, Mindy Stempin, Diane Fiorentino, Tim McKenrick.

Guests: 5 parishioners attended who are not members of council.

Cindy called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm. Father Scott offered the opening prayer.

Background:

Father Scott described the activities and the reasoning for them since summer when he, Father Matt, and Father Pat were appointed. It was decided to wait until after Father Ted retired to initiate any changes so that he would not have to deal with them. Father Ted considered several living options and chose the retirement home for priests in Depew. Father Matt stated that he was not on site and wanted to become acquainted with the area before considering any changes. Also, there were quite a few funerals in Batavia during that time. Our Family #12 is unique in the diocese, as it is a joint arrangement between a religious order and the diocese. It is structured to ensure stability, because there is a guarantee of having 4 priests assigned. No other family has a similar guarantee. The original plan of the diocese was to have the Road to Renewal process completed in each family in a year or two, but they have discovered that making decisions quickly has resulted in those choices requiring changes. It is now expected that the process will take 4 to 5 years.

Mass Schedule:

Before Father Ted left there was a discussion among the priests about how to structure the schedule. There was an attempt to maintain masses as close to previous times as possible. Father Ted recommended the 5:45 pm Saturday mass and the 10 am Sunday mass. Parishioners have questioned whether it would be possible for Elba to have a 4 pm mass and move the 5:45 one to Batavia. Father Matt stated that the two 4 pm masses in Batavia are very well attended. Elba does not have the space to accommodate that many people. People are asked to try out the schedule, see how it works, before making additional changes.

Next Steps:

Presentation – We will have a presentation showing the trends in our parish, using the information collected by the diocese. All parishioners are encouraged to attend. That presentation showing the trends in the whole family was presented at the meeting a couple weeks ago at Ascension parish. It is important to update our information to reflect reality. For example Father Scott reported on a parish having a large number of families registered, but many had not used their envelopes for over two years. These families were contacted to determine if they were interested in continuing their registration. Many were then dropped, saving money on the mailing, and better reflecting the actual number of parishioners.

Parish Groups – Before forming Pillar Groups, Father Scott wants to have the parishes in the family have group discussions reflecting the pillar topics. Selecting a couple of people to represent the opinions of the whole parish without extensive discussion could lead to false conclusions. He wants us to form groups of parishioners interested in a particular topic, meet with him in attendance, and then send representatives from the group to the pillar meetings. He would like us to have names to him when the presentation on parish trends occurs.

Sharing Resources – We need to see what we can do together. A positive event is the upcoming St. Joseph Table, with Ascension, Resurrection, and St. Padre Pio working together. Father Pat recalled that when St. Cecilia and Our Lady of Fatima first merged, each site had their own table. Eventually there was one table in Elba. The beginning of the merger was difficult, but the situations have improved with time. Father Scott noted that each parish has its own identity. Some have good attendance at social events, others prefer spiritual ones. It would be good to combine interests and increase attendance at both. We need to bring more people together, because we are an aging population. We need to consider who will be in the pews in 5 years, in 10 years. The priests are trying to break down the barriers that exist in the family; we can't have an us versus them mentality. That is not how we can be successful.

Closure rumors – Father Scott said that closure is not considered for our parish. We are an active parish, we pay our bills, and our buildings are well maintained. There is not a logical reason to worry about closure.

Communication – Poor communication has been an issue so far in our family. We need to improve. Father Scott wants to begin a monthly newsletter/calendar inserted in our bulletins to keep people informed.

Other – There was a question about the status of Deacon Paul. Father Scott said that there is a possibility that he will be assigned to Warsaw (Family #14), because that family is understaffed with only one priest there. Rick Pastecki reported that he is working with Deacon to have the Adoration on Thursdays. Deacon has committed to helping with it.

Adjournment: The meeting concluded at 8:52 pm with a closing prayer by Father Pat.

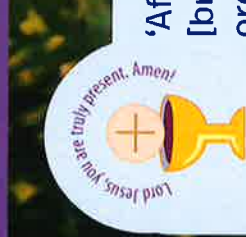

'After God's blessing has been invoked upon [bread that comes from the earth], [it] is no longer ordinary bread, but Eucharist, formed of two things, the one earthly and the other heavenly.'

—*Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1000*

All things are composed of two realities, a *substance* (literally “that which stands under”) and the *accidents* (its color, shape, taste, position, etc.). Before the priest pronounces the words of Consecration (“This is my Body”), the substance of the bread is bread (its “breadness,” if you will). Its accidents are also that of bread. It looks like, smells like, and tastes like bread.

After the words of Consecration, by a miracle that God works through the hands and the words of the priest, the substance of bread is removed and replaced with the substance of Christ's glorified Body. This Body is the one that he has in Heaven, unlike the bodies that we have. The same is true for the wine. The Body and Blood of Christ exist under the forms of bread and wine. The Eucharist, therefore, has an earthly part—the accidents of bread—and a heavenly part—the glorified Body of Christ.
