





St. Padre Pio Parish Unapproved Council Minutes March 12, 2024, 7:00 pm, Oakfield site

We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."

Cindy called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm. Mindy offered the opening prayer.

Minutes from the previous meeting: Motions to approve the minutes from the following meetings: March, 2023, made by Diane, seconded by Tim. Motion carried.

October, 2023, made by Mary, seconded by Tim. Motion carried.

February, 2024, made by Steve, seconded by Mary Ann. Motion carried.

Organization and Committee Reports:

Altar and Rosary – Diane – We will be reciting the Rosary at 9:30 before the 10 am mass on the first Sunday of each month. We are making the change because of the Saturday mass being moved to 5:45 pm. It will be led by Linda Giambrone. St. Joseph's Table will be on March 20th, between 5 and 7 pm. at Ascension Parish. Only 250 people will be served. Tickets available at the door, a free will offering is requested. Donations of food or money may be made to Diane or Pauli Miano. We have been invited to an A&R family breakfast at Ascension parish on May 5th after the 10:30 mass. We provided a soup donation to Lydia's Kitchen which is held at the First Baptist Church in Batavia, and we are considering doing it again. Because of the change in the mass schedule, we are undecided how we are going to hold the Glimmer of Love mass in December. A member questioned how an individual or facility should contact a priest for an Anointing of the Sick. Father Pat said they should contact St. Joseph's office at 585-343-5800. The office is open M – F between 8 and 12, but often someone is there until 2 pm. After hours, leave a message. It is important not to wait until the last moment to call.

Men's Group – Steve – The Chicken BBQ will be on Sunday, June 2nd. We are discussing purchasing AEDs for each site. There was discussion regarding companies, costs, and maintenance, etc. Diane said that A&R could help with the cost. Spring Clean Up is approaching and because of the shortage of volunteers, we are considering hiring professionals.

Bereavement – Eileen – No luncheons were provided during the Covid shutdown. Since then we provided 8 in 2022 and 8 in 2023. We are providing a reception for a burial on May 18th. We lost a few volunteers but also added a few new ones during that period. In 2021 we reviewed the costs for providing the luncheons and were able to maintain a \$3 per person cost. Because of rising costs, particularly for paper products, we now need to raise the cost to \$4.50 per person. The new refrigerator is wonderful, the old one is in the garage. Will be useful for Chicken BBQ's and other events. Our annual meeting will be in July when we review and update lists and procedures. We will consider providing receptions in addition to lunches if the family wants that alternative. There was discussion regarding how to increase funding, donations, etc. No action taken. Cindy thanked Eileen for chairing Father Ted's retirement party. Because of the weather, attendance was lower than expected. Attendees and volunteers were able to take out additional meals, and more were provided to parishioners on Monday. Nothing was wasted.

Faith Formation: Mary Ann – Stations of the Cross and First Reconciliation was held on March 8th.

The 13 students did the readings. Father Matt made the children feel comfortable. 74 people attended. First Communion will be on Saturday, May 4th in Oakfield at 11 am. A special mass is necessary because of the large attendance at the Sunday, 10 am mass. 12 students will be receiving the sacrament. May Crowning will be in Elba before mass on May 4th. The last day of Faith Formation is April 28th. The students are collecting alms during Lent that will be donated to Catholic Charities.

Stewardship:

Building and Grounds – Reg – The four new frames and louvers for the bell tower and the frame for the large window facing Maple Ave. are scheduled to be delivered to Oakfield by April 1st. Upon receipt, two coats of finish paint will be applied to the primed frames. Installation will take place as weather permits. The glass for the window will be inserted to finish this phase of the ongoing project. Restoration work on the 5 windows on the cemetery side of the church has been delayed. Routine maintenance is constant. We have been unable to find a cleaner for the parish, so we have arranged for the cleaner from Resurrection to help out.

Old Business:

Road to Renewal – Cindy – Our Family #12 was activated on January 29, when a presentation was given at Ascension parish showing the trends of membership, finances, sacraments, etc. of each of the parishes in the family. Father Scott intends to present that information for just our parish and would like to have a large number of parishioners in attendance. Before the pillar groups meet, Father wants us to organize some parish meetings to discuss the topics covered in the pillars. He does not want just one or two people representing the opinions of the entire parish, so he is suggesting the formation of parish groups. The individuals in the parish groups do not have to attend the pillars training and will meet informally in the parish. We need to have volunteers willing to participate in these groups.

New Business:

Council – Cindy, Linda – Council has not been functioning as it did before Covid and after the formation of our family of parishes. We suspended elections and several individuals resigned from council. Father Ted appointed only one person to replace a member. We were unsure how we would fit into the family structure. There was discussion on our previous procedures and how they have evolved. There was no decision at this time. It was decided to change our meeting dates to the first Monday of the month, in order to avoid conflicts with the 7 pm masses on Tuesday and Wednesday.

Ministries – Some of the procedures for ministers have changed since the appointment of new priests and the change in the mass schedule. People have adapted for the most part, but we may need to revise some procedures. It was suggested that the choir introduce who is celebrating the mass, as some parishioners are not familiar with the new priests and deacons.

Adjournment and Closing Prayer:

Mindy offered the closing prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 9:05 pm

How to Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet



The Chaplet is Prayed on a five-decade Rosary

1. Make the Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

2. Our Father

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

3. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

4. The Apostle's Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father

almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

5. The Eternal Father

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

6. On the Ten Small Beads of Each Decade

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

7. Repeat for the remaining decades

Saying the "Eternal Father" (5) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (6) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

8. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Eternal God in whom mercy is endless and the treasure of compassion is inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase your mercy in us.

That in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent. But with great confidence submit ourselves to Your Holy Will which is Love & Mercy itself.

The Divine Mercy Novena

In a vision, Sister Faustina learned that God blessed the Earth in consideration of His Son. She wrote, "I saw a great light with God the Father in the center. Between the light and the Earth I saw Jesus nailed on the cross in such a way that God, wishing to look at the Earth, had to do it through the wounds of Our Lord." (I,24)

"At three in the afternoon, implore my Mercy, especially for sinners. And although it only be for a brief instant, imbibe yourself in My Passion, especially in my abandonment at that of My Agony. This the moment of great Mercy for the world. At that moment nothing will be denied to the soul that implores Me through the merits of My Passion." (IV, 59)

Brief Prayer for three o'clock in the afternoon

"You died, Jesus, but Your death caused a spring of life for all souls, and the ocean of Your Mercy flooded the whole world. Oh, Fountain of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, flood the whole world, pouring out on us even Your last drop." (IV, 59)

"Oh, Blood and Water that sprang from the Heart of Jesus, source of Mercy for us, I trust in You."

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on **Good Friday**. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said:

"These souls cause Me more suffering than any other; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy."

In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her:

"On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy......On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

The different souls prayed for on each day of the novena are:

Day 1 (Good Friday) All mankind, especially sinners

Day 2 (Holy Saturday) The souls of priests and religious

Day 3 (Easter Sunday) All devout and faithful souls

Day 4 (Easter Monday) Those who do not believe in Jesus and those who do not yet know Him

Day 5 (Easter Tuesday) The souls of separated brethren

Day 6 (Easter Wednesday) The meek and humble souls and the souls of children

Day 7 (Easter Thursday) The souls who especially venerate and glorify Jesus' mercy

Day 8 (Easter Friday) The souls who are detained in purgatory

Day 9 (Easter Saturday) The souls who have become lukewarm

During the Solemn Novena leading to Divine Mercy Sunday should be offered each day for the day's intention.


